APPLICATION FOR MEMBERSHIP**

Objects of the Society

Application for Membership

A member will have the privilege of participating in the affairs of the Society, including the power to vote at any general meeting of members, free admission to the premises of the Society at any time when the Society is holding a show or other event and be entitled to a member's badge and one guest's ticket, and a free pass for a vehicle; and such other privileges as the members at a duly convened general meeting may determine.

Subscription

The annual membership subscription is \$15 for adults and \$7.50 for youth aged 17 years and under. Subscriptions are payable in advance on the first day of January in each year. No member whose subscription is in arrears can vote at any meeting. Any member whose subscription is unpaid on the 28 day of February shall cease to be a member.

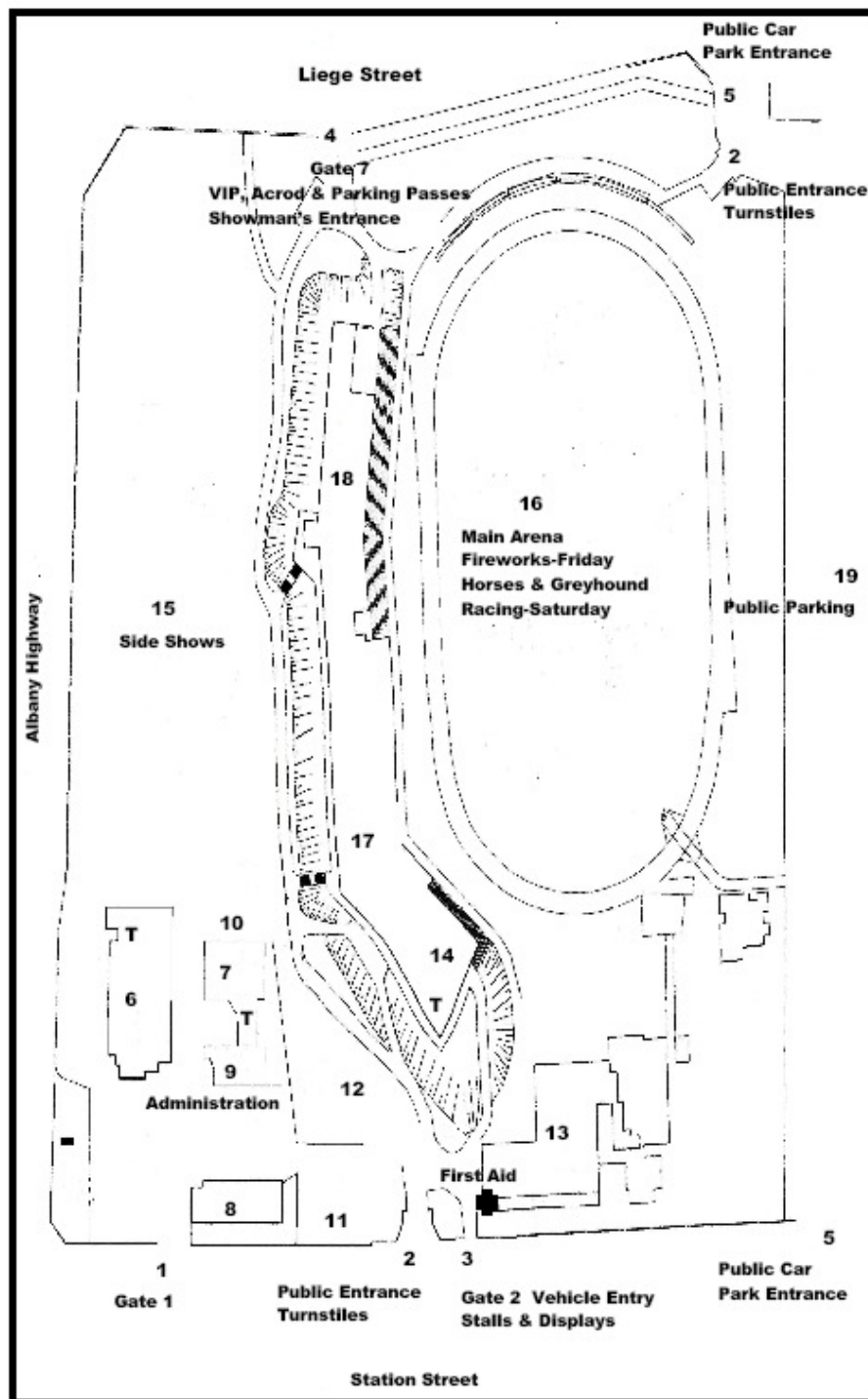

By-laws relating to the Conduct of the Canning Show

PURSUANT to Clause 38 of the Constitution of the Society, these By-laws shall prescribe the Rules and Regulations to apply to the conduct of the Canning Show.

1. DEFINITIONS

COMMITTEE - The Committee of Management elected at the Annual General Meeting of the Society.

EXECUTIVE OFFICER - is the Office Bearer of the Society appointed by the Committee to administer the affairs of the Society in accordance with the Constitution.

MEMBERS - The Members of the Society recorded in the Register of Members.

SCHEDULE – The schedule produced by the Society which describes the requirements for entries and exhibits at the Show.

SHOW - The Canning Show held each year.

SHOW GROUNDS – The premises of the Society located at the corner of Albany Highway and Station Street Cannington.

SHOW SECRETARY - The Officer appointed by the Committee to carry out the duties the Show By-laws prescribe and other duties and responsibilities delegated by the Executive Officer in respect to the conduct of the Show.

STEWARD – A person appointed by the Show Secretary to supervise a section of exhibits during the running of the Show.

THE SOCIETY – Canning Agricultural, Horticultural & Recreational Society (Inc).

2. ADMISSION OF MEMBERS

2.1 Financial members of the Society will be admitted to the Show Grounds on presentation of Member Tickets issued for the Show.

3. ACCEPTANCE & REFUSAL OF ENTRIES/EXHIBITS

3.1 All entries will be received subject to these By-laws and the Regulations and ordinary rules of the Society.

3.2 The Executive Officer may remove or refuse admission to the Show Grounds of any exhibit suspected of being dangerous or objectionable.

3.3 The Committee reserves the right to refuse, cancel or accept conditionally any entry without giving reason for doing so.

3.4 The Owner or Exhibitor of an entry subject to 3.3 will immediately remove their exhibit/stand of exhibits in a section/class specified in the Schedule.

3.5 Entries will only be accepted on the prescribed form.

- 3.6 Exhibitors are responsible for the accuracy of the description and eligibility to exhibit in a Section or Class specified in the Schedule.
- 3.7 Acceptance of entries closes at 12 Noon on the Friday 2 weeks prior to the Show. The closing date will be shown on the top of each Section in the Schedule.
- 3.8. Late entries will not be accepted.
- 3.9 Except for horse events every exhibit shall be the genuine property of the Exhibitor whose name appears on the entry form.

4. ENTRY FEES FOR ENTRIES AND EXHIBITS

- 4.1 Except for horse classes entry fees must be forwarded with the entry form to the Show Secretary who will issue a receipt.
- 4.2 Fees can only be paid by cash, cheque or money order.

5. ARRANGEMENT & MOVING OF EXHIBITS

- 5.1 The Show Secretary will determine the arrangement of exhibits in sections and classes.
- 5.2 Exhibitors must arrange their exhibits as directed by the Stewards.
- 5.3 The Stewards must give permission for an exhibit to be moved.

6. REMOVAL OF ENTRIES AND EXHIBITS

- 6.1 Exhibits can only be removed between 8.00am to 10.30am on the Sunday after the Show or as per prior arrangement.
- 6.2 The Show Secretary must consent to any removal of exhibits before the times in 6.1 above.

7. PENALTIES

- 7.1 Exhibitors will be liable for a penalty of \$20.00 for:
 - a. removing an official placard, ticket or ribbon affixed or posted by a Steward.
 - b. affixing any other placard, ticket or ribbon other than directed by a Steward.
 - c. refusing in any way to carry out instructions of a Steward.
- 7.2 The Committee can retain exhibits of offending Exhibitors until a Penalty is paid.

8. JUDGING OF AWARDS

- 8.1 All exhibits except horses must be on the Show Grounds at least 30 minutes before the time specified in each Section for commencement of judging.
- 8.2 Horses must be on the ground at least one hour before the advertised time for starting the event entered.
- 8.3 Stewards or Officials will be admitted to the exhibit area during judging.
- 8.4 Exhibits shall not display any ribbon, badge, mark, or name while being judged.

- 8.5 Judges can withhold awarding a prize if exhibits:-
 - a. are of an inferior description;
 - b. are not suitable for the Section and Class.
- 8.6 Judges can award a second or third prize, or divide prizes instead of awarding a first prize.
- 8.7 Judges can award a prize on merit if it is considered that there is no competition in a class.
- 8.8 Champion Awards will only be selected from exhibits that have been awarded a first prize in specified classes.
- 8.9 Only one prize card will be issued for each prize won.

9. PRIZE MONEY

- 9.1 Prize money will be paid from 2.00pm on the Saturday of the Show.
- 9.2 Prize money will only be paid on presentation of an Exhibitor's Ticket.
- 9.3 Prize money not collected by 12 Noon on the Friday after the Show shall be forfeited by the Exhibitor.

10. FORFEITURE OF PRIZES

- 10.1 At the discretion of the Committee, Exhibitors contravening any By-Laws and Regulations of the Society shall forfeit any prize awarded to them.

11. PROTESTS

- 11.1 The Judge's decision is final for
 - a. horse events: and
 - b. awards on merit
- 11.2 All protests must be:
 - a. made in writing to the Show Secretary.
 - b. lodged before 6.00pm on the Saturday of the Show; and
 - c. accompanied with a \$50.00 fee.
- 11.3 Where the Committee deems a protest to be unfounded or frivolous the fee shall be forfeited and paid into the funds of the Society.

12. DISQUALIFICATION

- 12.1 The Committee may disqualify any Exhibitor from exhibiting at any Show for such a period as it sees fit where:
 - a. the Committee is of the opinion there has been a breach of the By-Laws and Regulations: or
 - b. the conduct of an Exhibitor is considered to be unfit to exhibit at any Show.
- 12.2 A person who has been disqualified from exhibiting at any Show of the Society shall not be allowed to act as agent, representative or servant of an exhibitor at any of the Society's Shows.

- 12.3 The Show Secretary will not accept an entry from an exhibitor who has been disqualified from exhibiting at the Show or any other Show by an affiliated Society.
- 12.4 Where an entry is accidentally accepted it shall be considered to be void and the fee will be returned.

13. LIABILITY OF SOCIETY

- 13.1 Reasonable care will be taken to protect the property of the exhibitor.
- 13.2 The Society will not be responsible for any damage or loss incurred by an Exhibitor.
- 13.3 Exhibitors will not be insured at the cost of the Society.
- 13.4 The Society will not be liable for any damage to any Exhibits and it is a condition of entry that each Exhibitor shall hold the Society blameless and indemnified against any legal proceedings.

14. GENERAL

- 14.1 The Committee reserves the right and the Executive Officer may remove any Exhibitor, attendant or visitor from the Show without giving any explanation or being liable for compensation.
- 14.2 No entertainment shall be allowed without the consent of the Executive Officer.
- 14.3 No auction, sale of goods or exhibits will be permitted without the written consent of the Committee.
- 14.4 Only guide dogs shall be allowed on the Show Grounds unless permission is granted by the Executive Officer.
- 14.5 The Committee has the right to postpone the Show from the advertised date, and make alterations it considers desirable in the Schedule, Prizes and other Show arrangements.
- 14.6 The letting of ground space at a Show will be subject to the By-laws and Conditions relating to the Letting of Ground Space and Stalls.

By-laws to regulate the Use of Ground Space & Stalls at the Canning Show

PURSUANT to Clause 38 of the Constitution of the Society, these By-Laws shall prescribe the Rules and Regulations to apply to the conduct of the Canning Show.

1. DEFINITIONS

COMMITTEE - The Committee of Management elected at the Annual General Meeting of the Society.

EXECUTIVE OFFICER - Is the Office Bearer of the Society appointed by the Committee to administer the affairs of the Society in accordance with the Constitution.

GROUND STEWARDS – A person nominated by the Committee to oversee the allocation of Ground and Stall space

MEMBERS - The members of the Society recorded in the Register of Members.

LICENSE - The Receipt issued by the Society

SHOW - The Canning Show held each year

SHOW GROUNDS – The premises of the Society located at the corner of Albany Highway and Station Street, Cannington.

SIDE SHOW OPERATOR – A person, corporation or association of Showmen, granted a License by the Committee to operate plant & equipment or an exhibition for public entertainment at the Show.

STALL HOLDER – A person or corporation granted a stall holder's license to use ground space or a stall site. A Stall Holder shall include a Side Show Operator.

THE SOCIETY – Canning Agricultural, Horticultural & Recreational Society (Inc).

2. APPLICATION FOR GROUND SPACE & STALL SITE LICENSE

- 2.1 A License for ground space or a stall site shall be granted only when:
- a. the application on the prescribed form is received by the Executive Officer.
 - b. the License fee is paid in full at the time of lodging the application:
and
 - c. the application and fee are received at least one week prior to the Show date.

3. GROUND SPACE & STALL SITE LICENSES

- 3.1 The Rules and By-laws of the Society and general Regulations passed by the Committee which are in force at the time of the Show shall be construed as part of the Stall Holders License.
- 3.2 If for any reason the Show will not be held:
- a. a Stall Holders' License shall be cancelled:
 - b. any conditions attached to the License shall be cancelled
 - c. cancellation of the License shall free the Society from
 - d. any liability in respect of the Licence: and
 - e. cancellation of the License shall not give rise to any cause of action by the Stall Holder against the Society for damages or expenses.
- 3.3 The Committee reserves the right to cancel a License for non payment of the fee by the due date, or for any breach of these By-laws. Such cancellation shall be without prejudice to the rights of the Society in respect to any breach.
- 3.4 The Stall Holder shall comply with any additional rules and conditions which the Committee may apply to any License for a stall or side show.

4. ALLOCATION OF GROUND SPACE & STALL SITES

- 4.1 The Executive Officer or Ground Steward will allocate ground space and stall sites.
- 4.2 The Executive Officer's or Ground Steward's decision is final.
- 4.3 The Executive Officer or Ground Steward must consent to the alteration of the site dimensions or the position of the allocated site by a Stall Holder.

5. ACCESS TO GROUND SPACE & STALL SITES

- 5.1 A Stall Holder is entitled to have access to and use the ground space allocated under the License:
- a. only for the purpose specified in the License;
 - b. during the period of the Show; and
 - c. for such reasonable time before and after the Show as is necessary for the erection, installation, dismantling and removal of stalls, equipment and other property of the Licensee.
- 5.2 A Stall Holder will be permitted to enter the Show Grounds to store and install side show equipment from the Sunday to the Thursday prior to the Show between the hours of 8.00m and 5.00pm. Access outside these times must be approved by the Executive Officer.
- 5.3 Sideshow Operators and their employees who remain on the Show Grounds prior to and during the Show shall at all times comply with the rules of the Society and instructions of the Executive Officer in respect to behaviour, access and any other matter. Breaches of these instructions will result in cancellation of the License to operate on the Show Grounds.
- 5.4 By 30 minutes before opening time on each day of the Show:

- a. stalls shall be assembled and ready for operation; and
 - b. all vehicles of Stall Holders will have been removed from the Show Grounds.
- 5.5 The Executive Officer will determine the number of Show Ground admission passes to be given to Stall Licensees to allow for operating of stalls.

6. STALL & SIDE SHOW OPERATORS/SALE OF GOODS

- 6.1 Operators shall keep all stalls, equipment and exhibits in good repair and working order while they are on the Show Grounds.
- 6.2 The Society strictly prohibits the sale, distribution, or use in any way of fireworks, sparklers, water pistols or similar dangerous articles by a stall holder or their employees during the Show.
- 6.3 The selling or giving away as prizes, knives, swords, lasers, weapons of any kind are prohibited from the Show Grounds. The Committee reserves the right to withdraw from sale or exhibition any article which it believes could cause damage, nuisance or injury to the public.
- 6.4 A Stall Holder shall observe the provisions of all Federal, State and Local Government Acts and Regulations that apply to the operation of a Stall or Side Show. These Acts will include but not be limited to:
Occupational Safety and Health Act 1984
Fair Trading Act 1987
Gaming Commission Act 1987
- 6.5 If the Executive Officer closes a stall, side show or part thereof for breaching any Act or By-law, or for an infringement of the conditions of the License, the Society shall:
- a. not be liable to refund any License fee already paid by the Stall Holder or Side Show Operator: and
 - b. not forfeit any claim for the amount of any license fee due but not paid at the time of closure.
- 6.6 A Stall Holder may be expelled from the Show Grounds if there is any breach of the License conditions. Expulsion is at the discretion of the Executive Officer and does not prejudice the rights of the Society under these By-laws.
- 6.7 A Stall Holder shall not permit the use of ground space for the conduct of any game, show, entertainment or display, which the Committee believes, is not up to Show standard.
- 6.8 The use of amplifiers is prohibited, except for:
- a. use on riding devices:
 - b. "effect" inside an enclosure; or
 - c. the volume is kept sufficiently low so as not to unduly interfere with other Stall Holders.

7. UNAUTHORISED ENTRY TO THE SHOW GROUNDS

- 7.1 Where a Side Show Operator, Stall Holder or their employees force entry into the Showgrounds by a person or vehicle the Society may
- a. recover the cost of any resulting damage to the property of the Society by legal or other means; and
 - b. cancel the Stall Holders License by written notice.
- 7.2 Written notice of cancellation of a License shall:
- a. be signed by the Executive Officer.
 - b. be delivered to the Stall Holder or any other apparent agent or employee:
 - c. cause the forfeiture of any fees paid to the Society by the Stall Holder: and;
 - d. the Committee may refuse any future applications for a License.

8. CURRENCY OF BY-LAWS

- 8.1 These By-laws were passed by resolution of the Committee of Management at its meeting held on the 28 February 2006. These By-laws replace all previous By-laws or Regulations relating to the letting of Ground Space at the Canning Show.
